The 2019 QUEEN of the GULF REGATTA will be held off North Haven on the waters of Gulf St. Vincent, South Australia. The race will comprise of two Windward/Leeward races and one Fixed Mark race for Division 1 and Division 2 yachts with prizes for PHS Handicap results only.

1. Rules & Race Committee

- 1.1 The Racing Executive of the Cruising Yacht Club of South Australia (CYCSA) will conduct the 2018-19 QUEEN OF THE GULF REGATTA. The race will be conducted under the **rules** as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 (RRS); the Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing (AS); Rating and Class Rules as applicable; the Department of Transport Boating (safety and equipment) Regulations; and the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collision at Sea, 1972, and the CYCSA 2017 2018 Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 Where there is conflict between this Notice of Race (NoR) and the Sailing Instructions (SIs), the SIs shall take precedence.

2. Advertising

2.1 For the purpose of advertising, the classification of the Race shall be in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.

3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 The 2018 -19 QUEEN OF THE GULF REGATTA is open to all yachts, including trailable yachts. Boats shall be self-righting as defined in AS Special Regulations, Part 1 Appendix B.
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form, including the required fee, via this link (ENTER HERE). Entries will be accepted up until 15 March 2019. After this time a late entry fee may apply.
- 3.3 Boats shall be insured with third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000.
- 3.4 Boats entering from other Clubs shall submit copies of their **signed** safety certificate, rating certificate and insurance certificate to the CYCSA reception or by email to boating@cycsa.com.au .This changes rule 78.2.
- 3.5 The Racing Executive reserves the right to refuse or cancel an entry or require further documentation to support a boats entry in accordance with rule 76.

4. Classification of Crew

4.1 The ISAF Sailor Classification Code will not apply.

5. Divisions

5.1 The following divisions will be available:

5.2 The Racing Executive will allocate boats to a division.

6. Fees

6.2 Fees are non-refundable.

7. Sailing Instructions

7.1 The Sailing Instructions will be the CYCSA Sailing Instructions for the 2018-19 season, available on the club website www.cycsa.com.au, or from the Club Reception.

8. Scoring

Performance Handicap System (PHS) results will be decided by application of the Actual Correction Factor (ACF). The PHS ACF will be allocated by the Race Committee or its nominee and will not be subject to protest, redress or dispute. This changes rule RRS 62.1(a). The operation of the PHS is described in the CYCSA Notice of Race for the 2018-19 season, available on the club website (www.cycsa.com.au).

9. Schedule of Races

9.1 Time shown is the **warning** signal for the all divisions start.

- 9.2 There are no discards.
- 9.3 If abandoned the race will not be re-sailed.
- 9.4 If postponed the race may be re-scheduled.

10. Racing Area and Event Category

- 10.1 The Race will be conducted on waters off North Haven in the Gulf of St. Vincent, South Australia.
- 10.2 Boats shall comply with AS Special Regulations, Part 1, Category 6.

11. Courses

11.1 Windwrad/Leeward Courses will be as per SI 11 of the CYCSA Sailing Instructions for the 2018-19 season available on the club website. Race 3 will be a fixed mark race. The course will be available from the Boating Office 2 hours prior to the first warning signal. Positions of any permanently fixed marks may be found in the CYCSA Notice of Race for the 2018-19 season available on the club website (www.cycsa.com.au), or from the Boating Office

13. Prizes

- 14.1 Prizes will be awarded in proportion to the number of boats entered in a division.
 - A Prize will be awarded to first place only with five boats entered, prizes will be awarded to first and second place with six to seven boats entered, and prizes will be awarded to the first three places with eight or more boats entered.
- A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Bolton Yacht Services**, **Yeomans & Haskell Kitchens**, **Epiglass and A Payne** displayed in the bar foyer will be engraved with the names of the two PHS divisional winners of the **Queen of the Gulf Race**.
- 14.3 Prizes and trophies will be awarded on a later date to be notified.

14. Disclaimer of Liability

Warning

Sailing and activities associated with it involve risks of personal injury, loss, damage and even death.
