1. Rules & Race Committee

- 1.1 The Racing Executive of the Cruising Yacht Club of South Australia (CYCSA) will conduct the 2019-2020 Racing Season. Races will be conducted under Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2017- 2020; the Prescriptions and Special Regulations (SR) of Australian Sailing (AS); Rating and Class Rules as applicable; the Department of Transport Boating (safety and equipment) Regulations; and the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collision at Sea, 1972.
- 1.2 For boats competing in IRC races, the IRC Rules Parts 1, 2 and 3 shall apply.
- 1.3 RRS 55: RRS 55 will apply, disposal of sail bands is not allowed.
- 1.4 Where there is conflict between the Notice of Race (NoR) and the Sailing Instructions (SIs), the SIs shall take precedence
- 1.5 The notation “(DP)” in a rule in this NoR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

2. Advertising

- 2.1 For the purpose of advertising, the classification of all events unless changed by additional sailing instruction shall be in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.

3. Eligibility / Entry (DP)

- 3.1 Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form for each Series, including the required fee, via this link ([ENTER HERE](#)). Series Entries will be accepted until eight days prior to commencement of that series. After this time a late entry fee may apply. Each entry must be accompanied by a Safety Equipment Compliance Declaration audited by a CYCSA authorized equipment auditor plus a copy of a current insurance policy as required by section 14 of this notice. Failure to do so will result in a boat being scored DNC until all required documents are lodged. Owners are required to upload these documents to their Topyacht profile for ongoing easy access.
- 3.2 It is a mandatory requirement that a crew member from each competing boat attend the Season Briefing on Thursday 19 September 2019 at the CYCSA.
- 3.3 The Racing Executive reserves the right to refuse or cancel an entry or require further documentation to support a boat's entry in accordance with rule 76.
- 3.4 For boats racing IRC, no alteration to a boat's current TCC will be permitted one week before any regatta, except as a result of a rating protest, or to correct rating errors.
- 3.5 For boats racing AMS, no alteration to a boat's current TCF will be permitted one week before any regatta, except as a result of a rating protest, or to correct rating errors.
- 3.6 To be eligible to race all mono-hull yachts, including trailable yachts, must achieve a resistance to capsize as defined in AS SR. Part 1, Appendix B.
- 3.7 . The skipper and/or sailing master shall hold, or acquire within the racing season, a current CYCSA Safety Day certificate (or higher AS Safety & Sea Survival Course certificate). It is mandatory that those completing a safety course during the current sailing season shall provide the Boating Office with a valid certificate. A minimum of 4 crew (or at least 50% in excess of 8) participating in offshore races and all crew participating in short-handed races will be required to hold a current certificate for a safety course approved by the Racing Executive and completed within the last 3 years for CYCSA Safety Day or 5 years for the AS Safety & Sea Survival Course. The Racing Executive is mindful of our Duty of Care. If these requirements cannot be met, the skipper may apply for dispensation via the Racing Executive no later than 7 days prior to racing.
- 3.8 Scheduled date for the CYCSA Safety Day is 22 September 2019 and for the Australian Sailing Safety & Sea Survival Course is 2 & 3 November 2019.

4. Classification of Crew

- 4.1 The World Sailing Sailor Classification Code will not apply.

5. Sailing Instructions

- 5.1 Sailing Instructions may be available 2 weeks prior to the commencement of a Series or Regatta on the club website (www.cydsa.com.au) or from the Club Reception.

6. Racing Area and Event Category

- 6.1 Inshore races will be conducted within 5 nautical miles of the Adelaide coastline, including the Port River. All Club Inshore, Coaster, Twilight, Winter and Short-handed Short Course Series races will be Category 6.
- 6.2 Offshore races may extend beyond the limits stated in section 6.1. All Offshore series races and races in the Inshore/Offshore series that are also part of the Offshore Series will be Category 3.

7. Courses

- 7.1 Inshore Courses will be either windward/leeward or fixed mark. Where fixed mark courses are programmed, the course will be available at the Boating Office approximately 2 hours prior to the warning signal.
- 7.2 Twilight courses will be available at the Boating Office approximately 2 hours prior to the first warning signal.
- 7.3 Offshore courses may be altered so that the order of marks to be rounded is changed. The course will be described in the Supplementary SIs issued for the race. The start line will be set at approximately 90 degrees to the first mark. No flags will be flown or signals made to indicate the change other than described in the Supplementary SIs.
- 7.4 **Orontes Cup Race** (approx 55 nm)
From the Start to Long Spit Beacon (P), to Orontes Beacon (P), to Offshore Finishing Line.
- 7.5 **Haystack Island Race** (approx 200 nm)
From the Start to Marion Reef (S), to Haystack Island (P), to Seal Island (P), to Beatrice Islets Beacon South (P), to Offshore Finishing Line.
- 7.6 **Jubilee Cup Race** (approx 120 nm)
Start to Wreck Buoy (P), to Glenelg Breakwater Beacon South (S), to Snapper Point Buoy (S), to Macdonnell Sound Bcn (S), to Long Spit Bcn (P), to Orontes Bcn (P), to Offshore Finishing Line.
- 7.7 **Ardrossan Race** (approx 77 nm)
Start to Orontes Bcn (S), to Ardrossan Bcn (S), to Offshore Finishing Line.
- 7.8 **Adelaide to Port Lincoln Race** (approx 150 nm)
The race committee of the Port Lincoln Yacht Club (PLYC) will conduct and issue separate Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions for the Adelaide-to-Port Lincoln. Entrants competing in the CYCSA offshore series Adelaide-to-Port Lincoln Race shall also be entrants in the PLYC Adelaide-to-Port Lincoln.
- 7.9 **Island Cup Race** (approx 150 nm).
From the Start to Beatrice Islet Beacon South (S), to Orontes Beacon (S), to Offshore Finishing Line.
- 7.10 **Macdonnell Sound Race** (approx 74 nm)
Start to Wreck Buoy (P), to Glenelg Breakwater Bcn South (S), to Macdonnell Sound Bcn (S), to Offshore Finishing Line.
- 7.11 **Kintore Cup** (approx 58 nm)
Start to Wonga Shoal Buoy (P), to Glenelg Breakwater Bcn South (S), to Orontes Bcn (S), to Finish
- 7.12 **Glenelg Gulf Race** (approx 62 nm)
Start to Wonga Shoal Buoy (P), to Glenelg Breakwater South (S), to Long Spit Bcn (S), to Finish

Note: Discards are listed as a percentage of the number of races that achieve a result. The number of discards in a series is equal to the number of races that achieve a result multiplied by the percentage. Normal rounding rules apply, ie. 0.5 rounds up.

- 9.5 Race abandoned by a protest committee will not be re-sailed.
- 9.6 Postponed races may be re-scheduled.
- 9.7 Twilight races will not be re-sailed.
- 9.8 The **Commodores Shield** is an interclub series for keelboat yachts on the register of the CYCSA and the Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron (RSAYS).

- 9.8.1 There shall be three heats sailed on the dates shown in section 11. Should any of these races be abandoned, the next combined race in the inshore series schedule shall be substituted. If three heats fail to be raced, the series shall be abandoned and the shield retained by the current holder until the next series is decided.
- 9.8.2 The number of representatives in each division shall be equal and based on the lowest number of boats from either club in that division. The divisions shall be Division 1 and 2. For a division to be included, it shall contain at least three boats from each club.
- 9.8.3 Points will be awarded on PHS handicap positions in the combined fleets using the Low Point Scoring system of Appendix A. Points will be allocated and counted for an equal number of boats that finish representing each club in each division.
- 9.8.4 Regardless of dual membership, boats shall only represent the Club at which they are usually kept, either in the water or on a hard stand. A boat shall continue to represent the Club that it represented in Heat 1.
- 9.8.5 After the third heat, the losing Commodore shall present the Shield to the winning Commodore, after being suitably engraved with the name of the season's winner.
- 9.8.6 The winning Club shall hold the Shield for the subsequent season.

9.9 The **Tri-Series Trophy** is an interclub series for keelboat yachts on the register of the CYCSA, Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron (RSAYS) and the Port Adelaide Sailing Club (PASC).

9.9.1 There shall be three heats sailed on the dates shown in section 11. Should any of these races be abandoned, there shall be no substitution.

9.9.2 The number of representatives shall be equal and based on the lowest number of boats from any club.

9.9.3 Points will be awarded on PHS handicap positions in the combined fleets using the Low Point Scoring system of Appendix A. Points will be allocated and counted for an equal number of boats that finish representing each club the series.

9.9.4 The club with the lowest points from the series will be awarded the Trophy. In the event of a tie on points then the club with the most first places shall be the winner.

9.9.5 Regardless of dual membership, boats shall only represent the Club at which they are usually kept, either in the water or on a hard stand. A boat shall continue to represent the Club that it represented in Heat 1.

9.9.6 After the final heat, the losing Commodore shall present the Shield to the winning Commodore, after being suitably engraved with the club name of the season's winner.

9.9.7 The winning Club shall hold the Shield for the subsequent season.

9.10 Handicapping System

All Performance Handicap System (PHS) Series will be scored using the TopYacht handicapping software using the exponential option.

In the TopYacht system, three handicaps are defined;

AHC - Allocated Handicap. This is the handicap used for the current race. For race 1, this handicap is allocated by the handicapping committee. For subsequent races, the AHC is the CHC calculated from the previous race.

BCH - Back Calculated Handicap. This is calculated by the system and shows the actual performance of a yacht in a particular race. It is the handicap that when applied to a yacht's elapsed time, will result in the BCH *reference time* for that race. The BCH *reference time* is calculated to be the average time of the 46% yacht in the fleet.

CHC - Calculated Handicap. This is calculated by the system using the BCHs from the last three races and the parameters programmed into the system. It is the handicap that will be used for the next race.

During a series, yachts typically have one great performance and some bad due to breakages, etc. *Limits* are a mechanism to accommodate these anomalies. These function as follows:

Low limit: If the BCH is below this limit, the competitor is assumed to have broken something, etc and the BCH is not representative of a yacht's normal performance. In this case, the BCH for that race is ignored and the CHC will remain unchanged.

High limit: If the BCH is above this limit, the BCH for that race will be subject to the clamp. Two or more consecutive BCHs above this limit are considered as an improving performance. Thus the second and subsequent CHC averages will use the full BCH rather than the Clamped values.

A maximum downward change in the CHC over a series with reference to the starting AHC is limited to 10%. The maximum downward change in the CHC for Wednesday Twilight Cruising Series will be limited to 15%.

The handicapping committee may review any yacht during a series and make manual adjustments at their discretion.

Competitors who join a Series after one or more races have been run will be awarded the DNC score for the first (non-abandoned) race run after the competitor joins the series for all races prior to entry. Previously allocated DNC scores for other boats in the series will not be altered.

10. Penalty System

10.1 Rule 44.1 shall apply; a Two Turns Penalty will generally apply.

10.2 Decisions of the Protest Committee will be final as provided in rule 70.5

11. Prizes

11.1 Prizes will be awarded for all Series shown in section 11 in proportion to the number of boats entered in a series.

A prize will be awarded to first place only with five boats entered, prizes will be awarded to first and second place with six to seven boats entered, and prizes will be awarded to the first three places with eight or more boats entered.

11.2 The **CYCSA Yacht of the Year Perpetual Trophy** will be presented to the **Outstanding Yacht of the Season**.

11.3 The **CYCSA Crew Person of the Year Trophy** will be presented to a Racing Association member who has excelled in racing and/or race management.

11.4 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Allen G Walters** and named the **A G Walters Most Consistent Performer Trophy** will be awarded to the yacht judged to be the **most consistent performer** over the summer season.

11.5 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Richard Fidock** and named the **R H Fidock Bluewater Championship Trophy** will be presented to an offshore yacht. Winner to be judged on performance results for the International Rating System applicable at the time.

11.6 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **CORPOR8SOLUTIONS** and named the **Cock of the Walk Trophy** will be awarded to the yacht who crossed the line first most consistently over the summer season.

11.7 A Perpetual Trophy donated by the **Tillett Family** in the shape of a ships wheel will record all CYCSA yachts that compete in the **Sydney-to-Hobart Yacht Race**.

11.8 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Tollana Wines** will be awarded to the winner of the **Division 1 IRC Club Inshore Series**.

11.9 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Lloyd Sugars** will be awarded to the winner of **Division 1 PHS Club Inshore Series**.

11.10 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the CYCSA **Division 1 AMS Club Inshore Series**.

11.11 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Teachers Scotch Whiskey** will be awarded to the winner of **Division 2 PHS Club Inshore Series**.

11.12 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the CYCSA **Division 2 AMS Club Inshore Series**.

11.13 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Penfolds Wines** will be awarded to the winner of the **Coaster Series (PHS)**.

11.14 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the **AMS Club Coaster Series**

11.15 A **CYCSA** Perpetual Shield will be awarded to the winner of the **IRC Club Offshore Series**, and will be displayed in the Race Office.

11.16 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Becker Enterprises** will be awarded to the winner of the **PHS Club Offshore Series**.

11.17 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Malcolm Kinnaird** will be awarded to the **PHS winner of the Kinnaird Cup Race**.

11.18 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Maughan Thiem Motors** will be awarded to the **PHS winner of the Island Cup Race**.

11.19 A **CYCSA Perpetual online Honour Board** (*formally JOHN H ELLERS Perpetual Trophy*) will be awarded to the **first and fastest** CYCSA boat in the **Adelaide-to-Port Lincoln Race**.

11.20 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **David Woods** will be awarded to the winning CYCSA boat in the Adelaide-to-Port Lincoln Race based on the **International Rating System** applicable at the time.

11.21 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Deloitte** will be awarded to the winner of the **South Australian IRC State Championship Series Division 1**.

11.22 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **William Strangways** will be awarded to the winner of the **South Australian IRC State Championship Series Division 2**.

11.23 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the **South Australian AMS State Championship Series Division 1**.

11.24 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the **South Australian AMS State Championship Series Division 2**.

11.25 A Perpetual Trophy (The VICSAIL Telescope) donated by **Barbara and Colin Tunn** will be awarded to the winner of the combined results of the **Short-handed Short Course Series**.

- 11.26 The **Hans Neumann Perpetual Winter Series Trophy** will be presented to the winner of the CYCSA Winter Series (Division 1)
- 11.27 The **Hans Neumann Memorial Cup** will be presented to the Division winners of the Combined CYCSA / RSAYS Winter Series, and then later inscribed on the Trophy.
- 11.28 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the **AMS Combined Winter Series Division 1**.
- 11.29 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the CYCSA **AMS Combined Winter Series Division 2**.
- 11.30 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Hardys Wines** will be awarded to the **Combined Cruising winner of Twilight Series 1 & 2** after the final Twilight Race of the year.
- 11.31 Perpetual Trophies donated by **Greg and Carol Patten** will be awarded for the fastest Mono-hull, fastest Multi-hull and the winner of Mono-hull race on PHS sailing from the CYCSA North Haven to CYCSA Port Vincent Marina in the **Port Vincent Dash**.
- 11.32 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Bolton Yacht Services, Yeomans & Haskell Kitchens, Epiglass and A Payne** displayed in the bar foyer will be engraved with the names of the PHS divisional winners of the **Queen of the Gulf Regatta**.

- 11.36 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the **Premier's Cup Regatta Division 2 AMS**.
- 11.37 A Perpetual Trophy (The **Southern Cross Cup**) displayed in the Club trophy cabinet will be engraved with the name of the winner of the **Premiers Cup Regatta J24 Class**.
- 11.38 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the **Great Southern Regatta Division 1 AMS**.
- 11.39 A Perpetual Trophy donated by **Yacht Racing Services Association** will be awarded to the winner of the **Great Southern Regatta Division 2 AMS**.
- 11.40 A **CYCSA** Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the **Great Southern Regatta Division 1 & 2 PHS**.
- 11.41 A **CYCSA** Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the **Queen of the Gulf Regatta Division 1 & 2 PHS**.
- 11.42 A **CYCSA Racing Excellence Perpetual Trophy** may be awarded on an occasional basis to recognise exceptional performance at a National or International level of yacht racing.
- 11.43 A Perpetual Trophy (The **Klaus Barz Memorial Trophy**) will be awarded to the winner of the **Division 2 IRC Inshore Series**.
- 11.44 A Perpetual Trophy (The **R.N Evers Trophy**) will be awarded to the winner of the **AMS Offshore Series**.
- 11.45 A Perpetual Trophy (The **Annual Offshore Passage Trophy**) will be awarded to the winning CYCSA boat in the Adelaide-to-Port Lincoln Race based on the **PHS Handicap**.
- 11.46 A Perpetual Trophy (The **Leica Theodore Memorial Trophy**) will be awarded to the winner of the **Division 2 PHS Winter Series**.
- 11.47 A Perpetual Trophy (donated by **Brenton and Tracey Pegler**) will be awarded to the winner of the winner of the aggregate score for **Ladies Twilight Races**.

11.48 A Perpetual Trophy (The **M H Leonard Trophy**) will be awarded to the winner of each **Twilight Ladies Race in PHS Division 1.**

11.49 A Perpetual Trophy (donated by **Ray Brown**) will be awarded to the winner of each **Twilight Ladies Race in PHS Division 2.**

11.50 A Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the **Inshore Offshore Series.**

12. Radio Communication (DP)

12.1 Except in an emergency, or as required in Sailing Instructions, while racing, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions nor receive radio transmissions not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

13. Insurance

13.1 Boats participating in races conducted by the CYCSA shall be insured with third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000.

14. Disclaimer of Liability

14.1 **Warning:** Sailing and activities associated with it involve risks of personal injury, loss, damage and even death. The risks include, but are not limited to, the risk of injury from collision, capsizing, falling overboard, being trapped under a sail or boat after capsize and impact with equipment. The risks involved in this activity are increased by adverse weather conditions, inadequate training, fatigue, inexperience, failure to maintain the boat, failure to supply and use the recommended safety equipment and failure to observe the RRS, AS Prescriptions and the Sailing Instructions

14.2 The Organising Authority relies upon the provisions and limitations of the South Australian Civil Liability Act 1936 and notifies all race participants who engage in recreational activity that they do so at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race, **“The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone”**.

14.3 Having given this risk warning, the Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during, or after racing.
